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Overview

Deakin University is seeking to recruit an academic to join a team of established colleagues working at the Australian War College for the design, development and delivery of innovative curriculum for courses including the Australian Command and Staff Course and the Defence and Strategic Studies Course.

The Lecturer in Military History will report to the Deakin Academic Principal at the Australian War College. The Academic Principal is supported by a Head of Teaching and Learning, Head of Research and Head of Academic Skills Acquisition. Applicants will be required to attain a baseline security clearance as a part of the role.

Responsibilities

As part of the team delivering education services to the Australian War College, you should keep the following expected student outcomes in mind as you conduct your duties:

- reinforce and evolve the significant experiential learning provided by Defence's services and groups
- focus on the operational and strategic domains as well as the need to understand and operate within the broader Defence organisation
- prepare officers and APS executives for key staff appointments within Defence and other agencies so they are able to lead staff at operational and strategic levels and manage the business of Defence at the enterprise level
- prepare military officers for command up to and including formation and joint task force level
- foster international networks and relationships with military officers in partner nations
- develop habits of mind, personal mastery and critical faculties to operate in a competitive, technologically complex and volatile environment at the highest level of strategic responsibility.

The appointee will be expected to:

- provide an excellent contribution to Deakin University's design, development, delivery and assessment of AWC program modules
- enhance the quality of teaching and learning at the AWC, including identifying and responding to opportunities to advance the quality of Deakin's contribution to the course
- contribute to the development of AWC student research and writing skills through direct and effective supervision
- contribute to the academic community of the AWC and/or the Australian national security community
- develop strong relationships with research, community, industry and government for enhanced teaching and research outcomes
- contribute to the development of the Faculty's research agenda and reputation at the AWC through academic publications and engagement with the national security research community.

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Selection Criteria - Essential

- PhD in a relevant discipline and/or advanced qualifications and experience in the area of military history
- demonstrated capacity and passion for designing and developing effective student- centred learning experiences
- demonstrated capacity for positive engagement with research, community, industry and/or government to enhance the national standing of the discipline
- demonstrated capacity for guiding and supervising students in the development of research and writing skills
- excellent interpersonal skills and a proven ability to establish good working relationships with colleagues.

Selection Criteria - Desirable

- a proven ability to work effectively in a professional military education (PME) learning environment
- a track record of high-quality research and publication in relevant discipline areas and/or national security community publications
- knowledge, understanding and appreciation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and contemporary issues.
